We welcomed several new actors and facilitators to the ensemble. Our teens got standing ovations for 2 stage plays, including a record-breaking production of *Cyrano de Bergerac* at Chicago Shakespeare Theater. We officially launched programming for adults ages 22+. We more than doubled our fundraising goal for the year thanks to a windfall of individual giving. ### **SEASON HIGHLIGHTS**

#### THE SPY WHO KNEW ME WORLD PREMIERE

After almost 2 years of planning, pre-production, fundraising, filming, and editing, we debuted A.B.L.E.'s second feature film, *The Spy Who Knew Me*, in a red carpet event at **The Landmark Century Center Cinema on September 16**. Our cast, crew, and supporters packed the theatre for a first glimpse at our original spy movie and celebrated in a post-show reception at one of our filming locations.

Since the premiere, we have hosted private screenings and talkbacks of *The Spy Who Knew Me* at Vaughn Occupational High School, Northwestern University, and Misericordia. *The Spy Who Knew Me* was also named an official selection for the **2018 Chicago Onscreen**Showcase and will be shown through the Movies in the Parks programs at multiple screenings in August 2018.











#### **GEMS UNSEEN**

On **Saturday December 2**<sup>nd</sup>, our ensemble presented A.B.L.E.'s thirteenth stage production, *Gems Unseen*, to packed house at **Victory Gardens Biograph Theater**.

Over the course of 10 weeks, the ensemble of 21 actors, supported by a team of teaching artists and volunteers, devised their own tales for this performance around the central theme of inner beauty vs. outer beauty. Our devised shows are always special because they show the depth of our ensemble, and reveal what's in their hearts and minds. Actors built stories from the ground up, collaborating on every detail from scripting to staging. The finished performance featured 4 stories about 4 very different characters and the talents and strengths that lie beneath the surface.

#### CYRANO DE BERGERAC

We were overjoyed to return to Chicago Shakespeare
Theater **on Thursday, May 17, 2018** with an original adaptation of Edmond Rostand's classic story *Cyrano de Bergerac*. Actors spent the first several weeks of the spring semester working with teaching artists and facilitators to learn the characters and plot. In the final performance, actors shared roles, with each playing multiple characters—giving everyone a chance to be in the spotlight.

Cyrano was a landmark performance on many fronts. We smashed records for attendance (421 audience members!) and fundraising (over \$1200 in donations)!

We partnered with industry leader C2 to provide captioning for audience members who are D/deaf/HOH.

Lastly, Cyrano marked the final bow for two founding ensemble members: Emily Kwidzinski and Emily Lavin.

















### **SEASON HIGHLIGHTS**

#### **PARENTS TAKE A BOW!**

To help families understand what happens in a typical A.B.L.E. rehearsal and build relationships with our teaching staff and facilitators, we hosted our first ever Parent Classes. Participants tried their hands at devising, dropping in, building tableaux, and more. This helps parents develop a vocabulary to reinforce the work we're doing in rehearsals. They also get to see our talented team in action and appreciate the work, energy, and heart that goes in to each rehearsal.





### INCLUSIVE THEATER FESTIVAL

In November, A.B.L.E. joined companies from around the country at the **Inclusive** Theatre Festival, hosted by Seesaw Theater Company at Northwestern University. A.B.L.E. cofounders Katie Yohe and Lawrence Kern, along with actors Colleen Altman and Sam Radinsky presented on the programs history and methodology, and Katie also led a practical workshop around Strategies for Devising Theater.



# DEVISING WORKSHOPS WITH FRANTIC ASSEMBLY

On November 5th, members of the ensemble took part in a special day of workshops with the internationally renowned company Frantic Assembly. Based in the UK, Frantic is known for their unique physical approach to creating theatre, and has been responsible for movement direction for The Curious Incident of the Dog in the Nighttime, Harry Potter and the Cursed Child, and the TV series Humans. Visiting practitioner Krista Vuori led two sessions for our ensemble focused on developing skills for building choreography, and storytelling through movement.





#### **SUMMER WORKSHOPS**

We officially launched programming for adult ages 22+ on June 12th with a 5week workshop series. Each Tuesday, we focused on a different theme improvisation, physical theatre, puppetry, Shakespeare, and on-camera acting – to help both new and experienced performers hone their personal skills and build a community. Through the course of the program, we welcomed a mix of program alums as well as 6 brand new actors and we are well on the way to creating a regular ensemble in the fall!



#### FIELD TRIPS

We enjoy the opportunity to connect with the professional theatre community around Chicago, and to expose our actors to different types of performance.

In February, we enjoyed
Short Shakespeare: A
Midsummer Night's Dream at
Chicago Shakespeare
Theater. In April, members
of our ensemble saw BoHo
Theatre Company's
production of Cyrano de
Bergerac at Theatre Wit and
enjoyed discussing the play
and characters with this
professional cast.

### STRATEGIC GROWTH

This year, we took several steps to strengthen our organization from the inside out, and ensure that we have the capacity to grow into our long-term goals:

- ➤ Partnered with the Arts and Business Council of Chicago's

  Business Volunteers for the Arts program for an 8-month capacity
  building project. Our four-person BVA team gave a combined total
  of 133 hours of consulting valued at \$19,950. These consultants
  helped us to:
  - ➤ Assess **staff roles** to refine our **organizational structure** and workflow
  - ➤ Clarify and document **procedures and policies** on a range of HR topics
  - ➤ Update all of our **organizational materials** for our volunteers, staff, program parents and the public to ensure consistent and effective communication of program mission, goals, and procedures.
- ➤ Participated in the Chicago Volunteer Expo to connect with interested volunteers from around Chicago.
- ➤ Premiered an incentive program to recognize our donors at various levels.
- ➤ Launched our Development Committee, headed by several program parents and dedicated volunteers. In the first year, this committee has already exceeded fundraising goals. Most notably, our online #giveable campaign for Giving Tuesday raised \$2100. And our inaugural Trivia Night event in January raised over twice its original goal, earning a total of \$4440 to support A.B.L.E.'s programs.

#### LAUNCHING THE ADULT ENSEMBLE

This fall we will offer two sessions on Tuesdays with actors collaborating to produce a variety show in December.



#### **INVESTING IN OUR TEACHING ARTISTS**

We are supporting the professional artists who make our programming possible by formalizing our teaching artist training program and raising salaries.



#### **EXPANDING OUTREACH PROGRAMS**

We are actively seeking partnerships with local organizations that serve individuals with I/DD to offer workshops and residencies.



#### **GROWING THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS**

We are excited to connect with passionate professionals who can serve as ambassadors for A.B.L.E. in their communities and help shape our growth in the years ahead.



#### **INCORPORATING CAPTIONING**

After partnering with industry leader C2 for **Cyrano de Bergerac**, we are inspired to provide captioning to ensure we are creating accessible performances for both our actors and audiences.



#### STRENGTHENING THE DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE

Our team has plans for the return of Trivia Night, as well as a Giving Tuesday campaign, and am end-of-season dance party. These fundraising efforts will support our new programming and staff.
